

Bible Study: Why We Need Heroes of Faith

Primary Texts: Hebrews 11:1–2, 1 Corinthians 11:1

Overview of Study

This study explores why heroes of faith matter in our Christian walk. We're called to imitate those who imitate Christ—not because they're perfect, but because they show us it's possible to live by faith despite imperfections. God uses ordinary, flawed people to do extraordinary work for His Kingdom.

Key Points

1. **Heroes inspire faith by example** – Hebrews 11 highlights ordinary people who trusted God and lived boldly for Him.
 2. **Heroes don't have to be perfect** – Paul called himself the “chief of sinners,” yet God used him powerfully.
 3. **We must choose heroes wisely** – True heroes point us to Christ, not the world.
 4. **We are called to become heroes for others** – As disciples, we are also mentors, models, and encouragers.
 5. **Imitating Christ is the ultimate goal** – Paul said, “Imitate me as I imitate Christ.”

1. **Identify one personal “hero of faith”** from your life or Scripture and journal what they taught you about faith.
2. **Begin mentoring or encouraging someone** in their faith journey—intentionally live as a model for others.

3. **Read one story from Hebrews 11** each day this week. Note how God used flawed individuals.
 4. **Pray and ask God** to show you where you can step up as a leader of faith in your family, church, or community.
