

Bible Study Outline and Worksheet: Abraham's Faith in Action (Hebrews 11:17-19)

Overview of Study

In this study, we explore Abraham's faith as shown in Hebrews 11:17-19 and Genesis 22. Abraham's willingness to offer Isaac reveals deep trust in God's plan, even when it didn't make sense. This lesson challenges us to obey God fully and trust Him with our future.

Key Points

- ✓ Abraham heard God and obeyed without delay, even though the command was difficult (Genesis 22:1-3).
 - ✓ He trusted God's promise and believed God could even raise Isaac from the dead (Hebrews 11:19).
 - ✓ Abraham acted in obedience without needing to know all of God's plan.
 - ✓ Isaac also demonstrated trust, willingly participating in God's plan.
 - ✓ God provided the ram for sacrifice—pointing to Jesus as our perfect substitute.
 - ✓ True faith means trusting God's plan, even when it doesn't align with our understanding.
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Reflective Questions

- ? How does Abraham's obedience challenge your own faith walk?
 - ? When has God asked you to trust Him without knowing all the details?
 - ? In what areas are you tempted to negotiate with God instead of obeying fully?
 - ? How can Abraham's example help you trust God's provision in difficult times?
 - ? What step of obedience is God asking of you right now?
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Action Steps

- ✓ **Pray:** Write a prayer thanking God for His provision and asking for courage to obey.
 - ✓ **Reflect:** Identify one area where you need to take the next step of obedience.
 - ✓ **Encourage:** Share Abraham's story with someone who needs hope and encouragement this week.
 - ✓ **Journal:** Record how God has provided for you in the past to strengthen your trust for today.

Abraham's faith teaches us to listen, obey, and trust that God holds the future—even when we can't see the whole picture. Let's follow his example and walk in obedience, knowing that God will provide exactly what we need in His perfect time.
