Bible Study Worksheet: Joseph – A Hero of Faith

Text: Hebrews 11:22, Genesis 37–50

Focus Verse: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him,

who have been called according to his purpose." – Romans 8:28 (NIV)

Overview of Study

- Joseph endured years of hardship, but his attitude never changed. He honored God in each season.
- o He didn't wait for things to improve—he lived faithfully in the now.

4. God's Plan Is Bigger Than Our Lifetime

- o Joseph made plans for his bones to be taken to the Promised Land—400 years in the future.
- He trusted in a promise that wouldn't be fulfilled in his lifetime, showing true long-term faith.

Reflective Questions

- Am I trusting God's plan even when life doesn't make sense?
- Where in my life do I feel forgotten or overlooked?
- What role am I playing today that I need to be more faithful in?
- How can I remind myself that God is still working—even in silence?
- Am I preparing the next generation with my words, faith, and example like Joseph did?

Action Steps

1. Journal the Journey

Write down where you feel God has placed you right now. What might He be preparing you for?

2. Commit to Faithfulness Today

Identify one small way you can serve well—right where you are. Do it with excellence.

3. Release Control

In prayer, surrender a current struggle or unanswered question to God. Acknowledge He is working, even now.

4. Encourage Someone

Share a story from Joseph's life that reminds you God is in control. Uplift someone going through a tough time.
