

Bible Study Worksheet: The Faith of Noah

Overview of Study

This study focuses on Noah as a man of unshakable faith in a world full of wickedness. Key Points

- Noah Walked With God in a Wicked World – Genesis 6:9: He was righteous and blameless in his generation. His life stood out like a clean ceiling tile in a smoke-stained room.
- Faith is Passed Down – Noah's faith came through a lineage of believers—from Enoch to Seth. Faith must be taught consistently to the next generation (Deuteronomy 6).
- Obedience Requires Commitment – Noah obeyed fully—building the ark for decades, despite public ridicule.
- Faith Changes the Standard – Noah's life exposed the sin of the world—not because he was perfect, but because he was obedient.

Reflective Questions

- In what ways am I being called to obey God even when it doesn't make sense?
- What does it look like to “walk with God” in today's culture?
- Am I building a legacy of faith like Noah—for my children and grandchildren?
- Have I let excuses stop me from doing what God has clearly told me to do?
- Do others see a clear difference in my life because of my faith?

Action Steps

- Start Building with Obedience – Ask God to show you the one thing He’s been calling you to do—and take the first step.
- Evaluate Your Walk – Reflect on how your daily actions reflect a lifestyle of faith.
- Talk Faith Daily – Share what God is teaching you with your family during everyday moments.
- Commit to the Long Haul – Stay committed even when the results aren’t immediate.
- Be the Contrast – Shine brighter by doing what’s right in God’s eyes.

Noah’s life reminds us that faith is action. It’s not just believing in our hearts—it’s doing what God says, even when we don’t see the full picture. In a world full of compromise, Noah remained faithful.
