Bible Study: John 3:16 - The Gospel in One Verse

Overview of Study: This Bible study explores the heart of the gospel through John 3:16, showing how God's love is personal, sacrificial, and redemptive. Using five symbols (a heart, a broken world, a cross, a circle, and a question mark), we walk through the complete story of salvation and respond to the invitation it offers.

Key Points:

1. The Heart – God Loves You

- God created the universe with intention and purpose: to have a relationship with you.
- His love is personal and specific—He knows you by name and still loves you fully.

2. The Broken World – We Broke the Relationship

- o Sin entered through disobedience. Every person has fallen short.
- o Sin is believing we know better than God and choosing our way over His.

3. The Cross – Jesus Paid the Price

- Only Jesus could restore the relationship. He lived a perfect life and died for our sins.
- o Salvation is not earned—it is a gift from God through faith in Jesus.

4. The Circle – Eternal Life is Given

- o Jesus rose again and offers us eternal life.
- o Eternal life begins now with relationship, purpose, and the Holy Spirit.

5. The Question Mark – What is Your Response?

- o Salvation is available, but it requires a response.
- Excuses do not change the truth: God loves you, Jesus died for you, and eternal life is offered to you.

Reflective Ouestions:

- What does it mean to you personally that God loves you specifically—not just the world generally?
- Have you ever tried to "fix" your life apart from God? What happened?
- What does the cross represent to you today?
- How does knowing eternal life is a gift change the way you live?
- What is stopping you from fully trusting Jesus today?

Action Steps:

- 1. **Reflect** on how God's love is personal. Write down moments when you've seen His hand in your life.
- 2. **Confess** anything you've tried to control on your own. Invite Jesus to take full leadership.
- 3. **Pray** and thank God for loving you, even in your mess. Ask Him to deepen your understanding of the gospel.
- 4. Share John 3:16 with someone this week and tell them why it matters to you.

5. **Commit** to a next step: trusting Jesus, getting baptized, joining a Bible-believing church, or re-engaging with your faith community.

Conclusion: God's message is simple and clear: He loves you, we need Him, Jesus made a way, and now we must decide. John 3:16 isn't just a verse—it's an invitation. Will you accept it today?
